

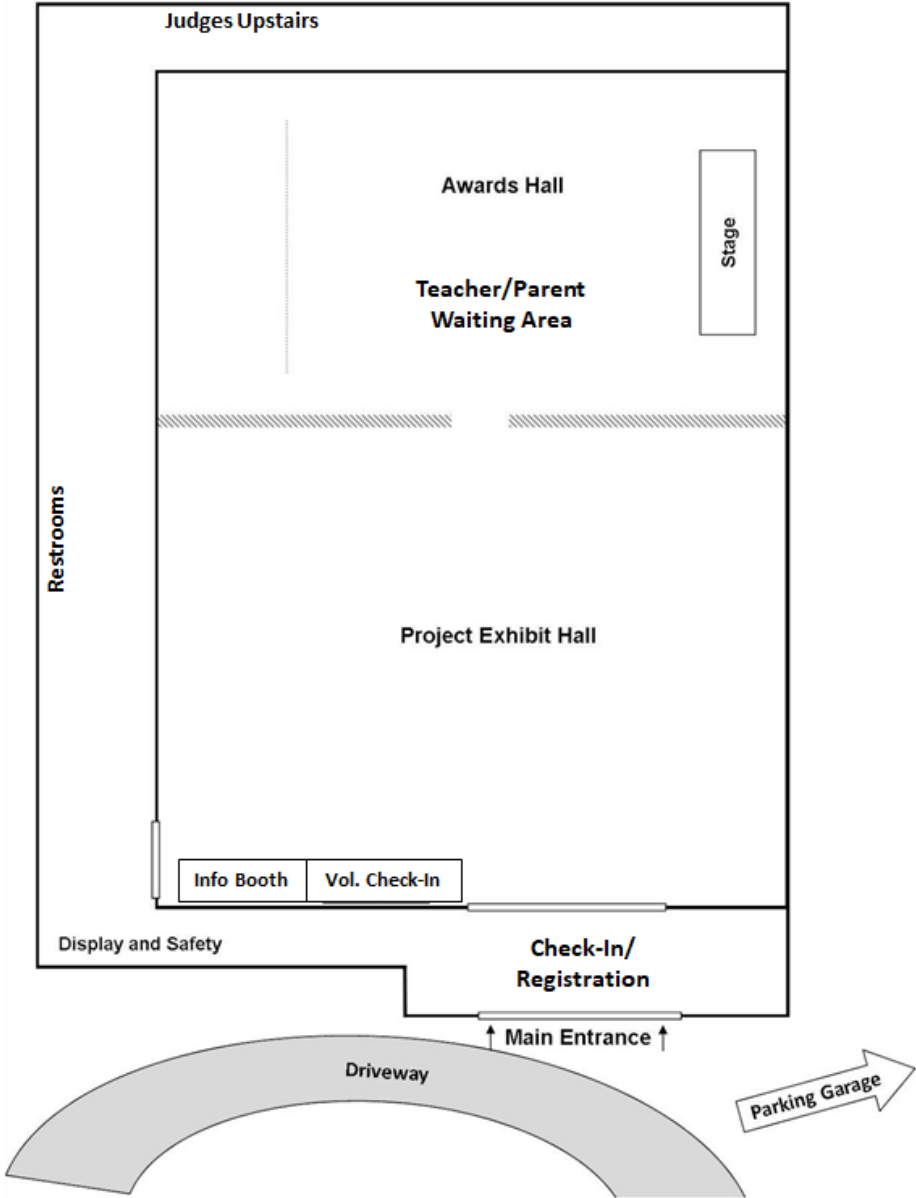


FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS REGISTRATION AND DAY OF FAIR

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Registration and Project Check-In/Set Up:

Q: What happens during Junior and Senior Division registration?

A: **Check in:** Find your school name in the lobby registration area to check in and pick up a label and card for your project.

Display and Safety: Take your project board and all components to Display and Safety for safety check and approval. Make any needed changes before leaving Safety and Display. Items removed from projects may be picked up at the Display and Safety tables after judging.

Set Up Project: Once you have been approved, set up your booth in the Exhibit Hall.

Judging day: Go directly to your project. Students do not need to check in again.

Q: Must the student be present during check-in/set up?

A: No, but the person who sets it up will need to give the information on the project card to the student so that they can find their project the next day. *We recommend taking a photo of the card and sending it to the student.*

Exhibit Hall and Judging:

Q: What can students expect during judging?

A: Students must wait by their project during the judging process. There are multiple judges in each category. The judging process will take most of the allotted time. Once judging is complete for an entire category, students from that category will be released until the Awards Ceremony. Senior Division students with projects progressing to second-tier judging will be notified by staff.

No food or drink is allowed in the hall.

Q: Must the students be present during judging?

A: No. It is not required but a large part of the judges' evaluation is the student interview. The judge will not be able to award full credit to projects without a student present..

Q: Are judge comments and scores made available to students?

A: Judges' comment sheets will be returned to each school after the fair. We will no longer mail the judges' rubrics.

Q: When should projects be removed from the Exhibit Hall?

A: Junior/Senior Division projects must be taken home either after the Awards Ceremony on Thursday evening or by 5 p.m. on Saturday. Projects left beyond that time will be discarded by Palmer staff.

Awards and Award Ceremony:

Q: Is there a charge to attend the Awards Ceremony?

A: No. Please join us! Parking is free.

Q: Must the student be present at the Awards Ceremony?

A: No, a student's award(s) can be picked up by a teacher or representative of the school during the ceremony..

Q: Do all members of a winning team receive an award?

A: Yes. Each student on the team receives an award.

Q: Can you purchase photos on site?

A: No. Families can take pictures of students and projects before judging or during the Awards Ceremony. We will have photographs of the Awards Ceremony available on our website after the event.

General Questions:

Q: Where do you park for the Science Festival and is there a charge?

A: Parking is available in the Palmer parking garage FREE of charge.

Q: Where are the restrooms?

A: Restrooms are located to the right of the south foyer, the west hallway, and in the Exhibit Hall.

Q: Where is Lost and Found?

A: Lost and Found items will be located at the Information Booth in the Exhibit Hall.

Q: What if there is an emergency?

A: *To report a major or medical emergency, call 911.*

For minor emergencies, contact a ScienceFest staff member wearing a green "Host" ribbon.

Q: Who can I ask for specific information not found on this sheet?

A: Issues should be taken to the Registration Desk or Information Booth in the Exhibit Hall. Both locations will be staffed by fair personnel.
